The University is still the hub of Higher Education in Rajasthan and attracts students from all over Rajasthan and other parts of India and also from abroad. The University believes that in its journey of 69 years it has brought about a transformation in Higher Education in Rajasthan and the country at large.

About IGC for HEEPS

Indira Gandhi Centre for Human Ecology, Environmental and Population Studies is one of the important Department of University of Rajasthan, Jaipur. It was founded in the year, 1984 and it is interdisciplinary in nature, providing equal opportunities to students from sciences and social science background. This centre was provided status of the Department on December 31, 1997.

About Seminar

Indira Gandhi Centre for Human Ecology, Environmental and Population Studies, University of Rajasthan, Jaipur is going to organize a National Seminar on 21st March 2018 to commemorate the International Day of Forests and World Water Day. Every year the International Day of Forests is observed on 21st March and the World Water Day is observed on 22nd March.

Roughly 1.6 billion people, including more than 2000 indigenous societies, depend on forests for their livelihood, food, medicines, fuel, and shelter and are benefitted indirectly by several ecological functions. Despite of these priceless economic, social, ecological, and health benefits, global deforestation continues at an alarming rate - 13 million hectares of forest are destroyed annually. Deforestation accounts for 12%-20% of the global greenhouse gas emissions that contribute to climate change. Hence, the United Nations General Assembly proclaimed 21st March as the International Day of Forests (IDF) in 2012 and UN first celebrated this day on March 21, 2013. This year the theme of International Day of Forests is "Forests and Sustainable Cities".

UN-Water is a unit that coordinates the UN's work on water and sanitation and also lays down a theme for the World Water Day analogous to a current or future crisis. This International day was recommended in the United Nations Conference on Environment and Development (UNCED) in the year 1992 at Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. In response to it, the United Nations General Assembly designated 22nd March 1993 as the first World Water Day. The theme for World Water Day 2018 is "Nature for Water" – exploring nature-based solutions to the water challenges we face in the 21st century. There is an urgent need for universal access to clean water, sanitation and hygiene facilities in developing countries. Today, about 2.1 billion people live without safe drinking water at home.
